Strategies for inclusive teaching, managing cultural sensitivities and adapting the curriculum to the needs of the student will be discussed by our speakers and participants in an open and informal environment.

Manar Chelebi, teacher, activist and author of the book "The Australian Muslim Student" will share her insights into working with the growing number of children from Islamic backgrounds within all educational sectors.

Erin Birch, a Koorie Engagement Support officer with the DEECD, will explain some of the issues affecting Koorie students and point to resources teachers can use to include an Indigenous perspective within all units (a requirement of the new Australian Curriculum).
